

- The Heath-Newark-Licking County Port Authority estimates more than 80% of the materials used on the bridge and an even higher percentage used on the overall project were from Licking County-based people and companies.
- The Port Authority's tracking lists 24 companies with Licking County ties that worked on this project.
- Over 100 people who either live and/or work in Licking County were employed in some capacity working on this project.
- The project is a \$2.9 million construction project with twelve key elements—road, bridge, walking path, storm sewer, and sanitary sewer among them.
- The project opens up new 70 acres for development, including a 60-acre rail-served site. It also incorporates improvements that benefit the Central Ohio Aerospace & Technology Center facilities that Boeing and other high-tech companies occupy in Heath.
- The Port Authority Board, at its August 2009 meeting, resolved to dedicate the bridge as the "Made in Licking County Bridge" in recognition of the people from Licking County who provided materials and labor for the bridge.
- A plaque will be installed on the bridge with the name and a 50-year time capsule embedded behind it that contains the names of the individuals and businesses from Licking County who had a hand in the road and bridge project.
