## Traffic Safety Blitz Continues

Customer surveys show it. People want to see vigorous enforcement of on-site traffic and parking rules. The Port Authority deployed a "blitz" effect this week to raise awareness. A speed detector trailer, on loan from transportation agency LCATS, is deployed on the west side of The Base. The device displays to approaching drivers what their speed is while they approach a 25 MPH sign. The trailer is part of the Traffic Enforcement Blitz all week at The Base that, on Thursday, yielded eight tickets for violations of parking lot regulations.
