10-Year Capital Plan Review Begun

As has been its pattern for some time now, the Port Authority has engaged in an update to 10-year capital plan. Over \$11.6 million in improvements are expected by 2019. The plan also includes an incorporation of the Port Authority's Revenue Diversity Plan which predicts up to \$140 million in projects in the next 10 years. Public input is sought on the plan, including an input session on April 7 at 2 p.m. at the Port Authority office.
